#### **OUTCOMES for the Academic Year 2018 - 19**

#### Review -

- Two pupils receiving Pupil Premium Funding are registered on the Special Educational Needs Code of Practice, one of whom has an EHCP
- Pupils who have receiving Pupil Premium Funding this academic year have demonstrated increased ability to
  express themselves and communicate with others through spoken language. This has increased their
  engagement and interaction in lessons and has increased self-esteem and social interaction
- Pupils receiving Pupil Premium funding have increased their self-awareness and their ability to recognise and communicate their needs and emotions
- 83% of all pupils receiving Pupil Premium Funding made expected or better than expected progress in Reading
- 83% of all pupils receiving Pupil Premium Funding made expected or better than expected progress in Writing
- 50% of all pupils receiving Pupil Premium Funding made expected or better than expected progress in Maths
