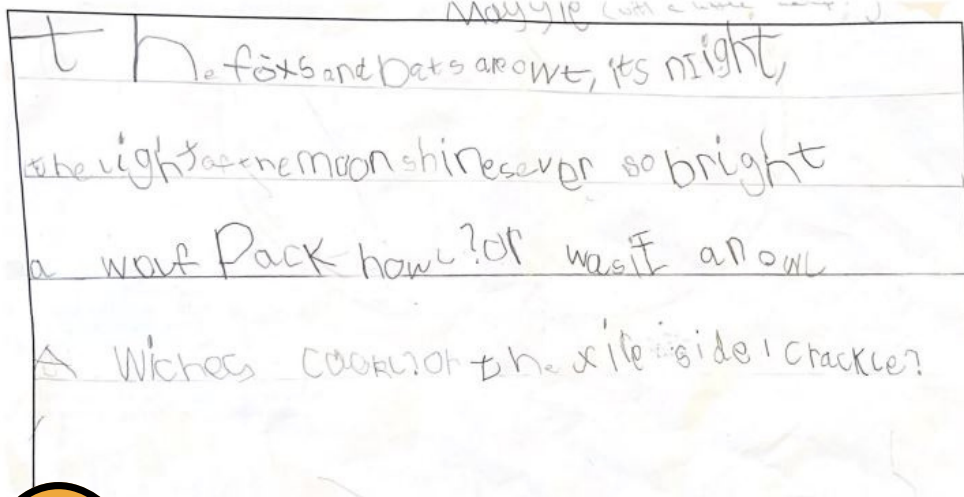

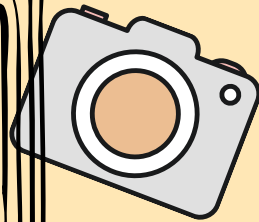

- Reception have been reading the book Funny Bones and learning about how important our bones are to move around. To add to this learning opportunity, the children were visited by Dr Bull, who kindly brought in resources and spoke to the children in more detail. Reception also focused on repeating patterns, including patterns in rhythm and colour patterns.
- In Year 1 this week the children have been focusing on the story 'Owl Babies'. They have been completing a range of activities with an owl focus and the children at forest school have been finding out all about owls and what they eat. The children have also been thinking about Harvest and why we give food to others and are thankful for the food we have. They looked at different types of food and where it comes from.
- What a busy week in Year 2! We have been finding out where the food we eat comes from – it comes from all over the world. At Harvest time we remember all the hard work done by farmers across the world who grow the food we eat and this was reflected in the acrostic poems we wrote. Castle Day was the highlight of the week! It was wonderful to see everyone in their costumes and we tried juggling, calligraphy, sewing and tested out our castle defences by playing a game with a partner!

FOREST SCHOOL

We've spent the sessions discussing nocturnal animals, what it means, who they are, how do we know they're around etc. The children were very interested in the clues that tell us which animals have visited our camp in the night. As part of this, we looked at owl pellets that I've found there and discussed those further.

The children were invited to build a hedgehog house, using whatever woodland materials they could find. This proved quite popular. (Pics attached).

Today we set up a nature camera in the camp to see which nocturnal animals we might spot. The children helped sprinkle some biscuit crumbs to tempt the animals! The footage will be shared once we're back from half term!

We've talked a lot about the season and all the different signs that tell us we're in autumn. A particular fascination was the sweet chestnuts, and spotting all the areas where the squirrels had been feasting on them.

In Surrey there has been an increase of 63% in positive COVID cases. If you are in any doubt about your child's health including a cold, vomiting, diarrhoea and being 'under the weather' we recommend seeking a PCR test (at a testing centre). Tests are readily available at walk in and drive in centres with results turning around within 12/24 hours. These are always free of charge. We strongly encourage all families to regularly test (twice weekly) the whole family including young children, as there have been many cases in Surrey of children and adults being positive with COVID without any symptoms whatsoever.
