Year 2 fire at forest school

- Reception had an intruder this week... GOLDBLOCKS! We searched for clues and tried the Three Bear's tasty porridge. In maths we have been learning one more and one less of a number. We learnt about why we wear poppies for Remembrance Day and created our own.
- This week in Year 1 we started our Toys topic by reading and writing about the story 'Kipper's Toybox'. In maths we are continuing to work hard on subtracting numbers and in computing we learnt about how to be safe online with 'Smartie the penguin'.
- Year 2 spent some extra time at our Forest School this week, enjoying the delights of a campfire. They studied aspects of the fire – the movement of the flames, the sparks fading into specks of ash – and used onomatopoeia to describe these aspects, as well as creating calligrams (words written to make a picture to visually illustrate what the word means). They used their experience to inspire their own effective "shape" poems about fire. In Science the children have been researching how different materials can be used. In History we have begun to find out about the Great Fire of London as well as learning a little about Remembrance Day and the significance of the poppies which the children have had the opportunity to buy this week.

This week the children took part in a beautifully respectful Remembrance Day assembly. I was so impressed with the collective silence we did together - you could hear a pin drop. Well done children. Of course, this was then followed up with a lot of discussion about what the day is all about etc. More information can be found on the second page of this newsletter.

Next week we will celebrate Road Safety week. Teachers have prepared lessons and interactive activities to reinforce and remind children of the expectations when crossing the road with an adult. At this age, we do not promote children crossing the road by themselves - our messages will be around how to keep safe when walking on pavements and crossing roads with an adult.

We have had a good start to this term with COVID cases and isolation - this is due to parents being vigilant and testing as much as possible. Please continue to do this and do call the office if you are in any doubt as to whether your child should attend school.

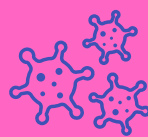
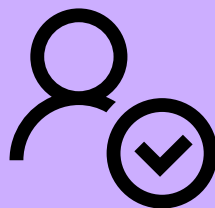
FOREST SCHOOL

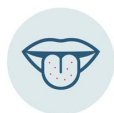

In Surrey there has been an increase of 63% in positive COVID cases. If you are in any doubt about your child's health including a cold, vomiting, diarrhoea and being 'under the weather' we recommend seeking a PCR test (at a testing centre). Tests are readily available at walk in and drive in centres with results turning around within 12/24 hours. These are always free of charge. We strongly encourage all families to regularly test (twice weekly) the whole family including young children, as there have been many cases in Surrey of children and adults being positive with COVID without any symptoms whatsoever.
