- This week the children in Reception became superheroes! Their book of the week was named 'Ten Little Superheroes' they made their own masks and capes and even wrote their about their own super powers. The children also investigated which materials would keep their superhero dry. In maths we have been exploring the numbers 6, 7 and 8. Writing and recognising them. For internet safety we explored Digiduck and the magic castle, using emojis to link to characters and how they were feeling when using the internet. In phonics we learnt the 'ch' digraph sound and went on a mission into the forest to search for this sound.
- This week Year 1 have been learning all about questions and how to use a question mark in their writing. They listened to the story 'Monkey Puzzle' which had lots of great adjectives in and then wrote clues and a question to give to each other to guess the animal they were describing. The children loved watching our new gates being installed this week and have been asking lots of questions about the machines they saw and the jobs the builders were doing which really helped them get ideas of how to ask questions for English too. They have had lots of learning and activities related to Safer Internet Day and Mental Health Week so hopefully they now know ways to stay safer online and how to look after their emotional wellbeing.
- What a busy week! Year 2 have been exploring 2d shapes in Maths and have begun to look at lines of symmetry. In Science they have been finding out about food chains and how one species depends on another. As you are aware, the children have been inspired by their study of animal habitats, and in particular the rainforest. They are keen to make sure our world is cared for and protected, so this week they have written letter to our local MP to highlight their concern for the natural world. We were absolutely thrilled by the wonderful dioramas the children produced! Their habitat models were so realistic and we were very impressed by the imaginative use of materials and attention to details. Thank you so much for supporting your children to create such amazing models. They should be very proud of their superb efforts! We hope you enjoyed the chance to look through the children's books this week and see the progress they have made so far this year. We look forward to continuing to support the children's learning journeys after the half term break.

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HALF WAY THERE. Can you believe it? Today marks 50% of this academic year complete. Excitingly, it also means we have another term and half left!

This week has had two main focuses - Safer Internet Day and Children's Mental Health Week. I ran assemblies with all children. We spoke about the importance of always being with an adult when they are accessing the internet. I explained that if children ever see anything online that scares or upsets them, they must speak to an adult at home or in school. Parent's should not leave children on devices unattended. It is also helpful to know that there are almost always, children friendly versions of popular apps e.g. YouTube Kids. Today we spoke about mental health, what it is and how we need to keep our minds and brains healthy, just like we do for our bodies. We discussed thoughts and feelings and how everyone reacts differently to different circumstances. These are great conversations to be having at home. At the very least, children should always know that when they are feeling down, upset or anxious, that they know talking about it will make them feel a little better.

When we return we will have the Breck Foundation in to run workshops with year one and two.

Please remember, tomorrow the school is closed to pupils. We return on **Monday 21st February.**

We welcome Ms Heath as a new mid day supervisor and Ms Webb as a Year 2 teaching assistant. I hope you have a relaxing and enjoyable half-term

Thank you for your patience whilst our new gates were being fitted. This work has now been completed.


Entrance to the school

Our new main entrance to the school is now near our caretakers house. There is a pedestrian gate for use of parents and children. This gate will open from 08:25am - 09:00am (registers still close at 08:45am) to allow for children that are late for school. The gate will automatically unlock at 08:25am. Just simply push the gate all the way open, until it locks open in place.

The KS1 gate that we have been using constantly during the works, will be open from 08:25am - 8:45am. The gate will automatically unlock at 08:25am. Just simply push the gate all the way open, until it locks open in place. The gate will close at 08:45am automatically. After this time, children must enter the school through our new main entrance as mentioned above.

Exit from the school

Our main entrance pedestrian gate AND the KS1 gate will be open at 14:45pm - 15:15pm. Just simply push the gate all the way open, until it locks open in place from this time.



Any clubs during half-term will be accessed via the KS1 gate. This is for both drop up and pick up.

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Are you a working parent looking for high quality childcare?


