pictures explained...

Reception: What a busy week! The key text in Reception was Mr Wolf's Pancakes and the children enjoyed helping Mr Wolf make the pancakes this week. They just loved a visit from the police officers where the children enjoyed dressing up, sitting in the van, helping set up a road accident and watching/hearing the sirens. The children learnt how the police can help and the importance of keeping safe by the road. In maths, the children have learnt to add by combining groups and have learnt two new digraphs; 'ng' and 'nk.' The children were so excited to dress up for World Book Day and all enjoyed sharing their favourite book with the class. The children in Diamond Class enjoyed their first Forest School session in the woodland, with Ruby Class looking forward to their first session next Tuesday!

In year 1 this week we have had lots of fun with all of the extra curricular activities planned. The children loved their visit with the police where some of them dressed up and got locked in a police van. World book day generated some great conversations about favourite stories, the children enjoyed listening to lots of stories and showing off their costumes. The rest of the week was more normal where they were continuing thinking about designs for their vehicles in DT, carrying out Science experiments and discussing similarities and differences between bathrooms now and in Victorian times.

Year 2 have been exploring fractions this week - finding half and quarter of shapes and quantities. As well as practical investigations, we have encouraged the children to make links with their knowledge of division by 2 and by 4. In writing, the children wrote about the characteristics and habits of dragons, organising their work clearly under sub-headings. The children are keen to promote their values on looking after our world, and having found out more about how materials are recycled, they designed their own new products, using reusable and recyclable materials. This week has brought some additional excitement, and they were thrilled to welcome the officers from Surrey Police who told them about their work, and on Thursday the children had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day and we were very impressed by their amazing costumes! Thank you for supporting your children and helping them to immerse themselves in their characters!

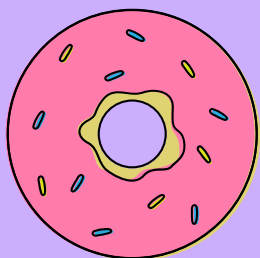

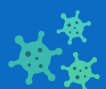
