

Reception: This week the children have listened to the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. They have used their fine motor skills to make their own beanstalk and written a wanted poster for Jack or the Giant. In maths, the children have been investigating measure. They have measured and ordered lengths and heights using non standard units and discussed the terms 'longest', 'shortest' and 'tallest.' The children have learnt to read and write the sounds 'ai' and 'ee'. For international women's day, Franek in Diamond class gave out flowers to the girls and ladies in his class. What a lovely gesture!









Year 1 have had another exciting week. They have been continuing learning about homes in the past and focused on a Victorian wash day. They were able to explore real artefacts and had a presentation from the Surrey Heath Museum. It really brought their learning to life and they loved dressing up in some of the old clothes. In DT the children finished off their vehicles by adding their wheels and axles and extra details. They were able to test them out to check that they worked which was great fun. The children have really enjoyed this DT project. In maths we have been counting in fives and moving on to measuring objects by their length and height. The children went into the woodland to look for different things they could order and compare the length of. It was great to be able to get outside and enjoy the outdoors and woodland more now that the weather is brightening up.






