To help celebrate Earth Day, this week children in Reception have been learning about our planet and enjoyed listening to the story of 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. The children shared lots of great ideas of how we can all look after the environment. They helped to keep our school grounds tidy by litter picking and enjoyed a 'paper free' afternoon to reduce the use of paper. The children just loved using chalk and whiteboards as an alternative and playing with some new equipment outside. In maths, the children have been exploring the properties of 3D shape. They have learnt to name some of these shapes and used the vocabulary round, tall, pointy, flat and corners. In phonics, the children have reviewed their phase 3 sounds within reading and writing.

Year 1 have come back well this week and have been ready to listen and learn. They wrote about their Easter holidays and instructions for planting seeds in preparation of planting seeds in Science next week. They have practised lots of blending with words containing consonant blends such as strong, scrap, spring etc and are doing well with trying to use their robot arms and blending hands to help them sound out and write these words too. In maths we have looked at odd and even numbers and recapped counting in 2s. The children loved the first lesson of our new PE topic of invasion games where they learnt how to control a ball with their feet and what the role of an 'attacker' and 'defender' is.

It was great to see the children back in school this week, ready to learn. Although there has sometimes been a chill in the air, Year 2 have been making use of our outdoor spaces this week. A walk in our woodlands inspired some super descriptive writing, and as part of our exploration of plant life in Science, the children set up their experiments to find out if plants might grow in unexpected conditions. We looked at varying the usual criteria for growing plants and we can't wait to find out if our seeds will thrive in Coca-Cola instead of water or in the fridge instead of at room temperature! In Geography, the children explored map symbols, and we hope that this will provide some useful skills for any adventures they may have in the summer months! In Maths, we have been learning to tell the time on the hour and on the half hour. We use analogue clocks in school and we are happy for children to wear an analogue watch in school. However, these should be discreet, and should not be a distraction to learning, in which case we will ask the children to put their watch safely in their book bag.


