In the last few newsletters I have kept the 'Pantosaurus' link to the NSPCC website below. Unfortunately this week we have had a handful of children (all boys) not being sensible and showing children their underwear. Although this may not seem like an urgent safeguarding concern, we are setting the tone now that privates are always private, no matter the environment. It is better to have these conversations now to embed the

understanding sooner rather than later.

Our eldest children will sit their SATs over the next few weeks. We make a conscience decision in school to keep these very low key and not at all daunting for the children. It is our intention that the children will sit their SATs with no additional stress or worry - we have to be sensitive of their young age. These tests help to inform the overall teacher assessments that staff will make at the end of the year. These are reported at the end of the summer term.

We have monitored attendance this week. On the whole attendance is good in the school, but it is dipping slowly. With the warmer weather, more fresh air and the incidence of common colds reducing I suspect this will increase. Please make sure your child attends school every day unless unwell. If you are not sure if you should send them in, call the office and they will give you guidance.


This week Reception children have learnt the stages of a butterfly life cycle and have continued to enjoy watching the caterpillars grow in Ruby and Diamond Class. The children have loved searching for and exploring minibeasts in the woodland and outside area. They have enjoyed planting flowers to attract the minibeasts into the playground. In phonics, the children have been reading and writing the digraphs 'ar' and 'ur'. In maths, they have continued to work with 'teen' numbers by representing numbers up to 20 with Numicon and using a 'ten frame.'













This week in Year 1 we have been looking at the story of the Scarecrow's Wedding. The children loved writing a list of things that they would collect for their wedding and they wrote a missing poster to help Betty find Harry using lots of adjectives. The children learnt how to do a running stitch and made a binca bookmark in DT in preparation for making our puppets over the next few weeks. It was quite tricky but all the children tried really hard to concentrate on what they were doing. In Maths we have been learning about arrays where they were making rows of equal amounts and finding the total. This is the beginnings of multiplication and understanding what that means.

Year 2 have been investigating length this week in their math lessons. We have learned how to measure length using different units of measurement, and we have compared and ordered different lengths, sometimes with different units (eg comparing 13cm to 3 m). In English we also made comparisons with Horrid Henry and his brother Perfect Peter, and wrote character descriptions of Peter. His character is very different to Henry's! Our investigation of plants have continued in Science – our seeds are beginning to grow! There have been some surprising results and we will continue to monitor the experiments we have set up over the coming weeks. This complemented our study of healthy foods in Design Technology. We have been learning about where our food comes from and what makes food appealing, in preparation for designing and making a food product. In Geography we have been using compasses and maps to plan and follow routes. Some of our coding work in Computing has helped with understanding position and direction. In RE the children have been learning about Islam and how calligraphy and colour is sometimes used by Muslims to represent aspects of their beliefs.


