WELL DONE to our fabulous year two children! All of them have now completed all of their SATs papers. The results of these papers are used to assist teachers with their end of year assessment judgements. Parents will be notified of how their child did, via the end of year school reports in July. It was so refreshing to see smiles and cheers when I entered each classroom with the papers. A clear sign that our year 2 staff have considered the emotional well-being of our students, which is always at the forefront of our minds. Uniform in school is starting to becoming very varied, particularly footwear. Children should come into school with sensible black shoes, not trainers (unless they have PE or similar).

On a safeguarding note, some children have been speaking about an online game called Huggy Wuggy. A quick Google search will instantly make it clear that this is not a child friendly game. The characters are vicious in their nature with scary mouths. Please do not let your child play this game online.

In assemblies this week we spoke about families. How diverse they can be. We spoke about accepting, respecting and embracing all types of families. Those with single parents, those with both, those with two mums or dads, those with step-family members, those with grandparents and those with carers. There is a helpful poster on our Twitter and Facebook accounts. The children were not fazed in the slightest by any of these discussions, a true testament to your parenting at home.

Attendance at school is really quite low. I can't tell you how important the summer term is for our children as we prepare them for their new year group. Unless your child is unwell, they should be in school every day, on time

'What did you do today?' 'Nothing'

That's not true, take a look at this!

This week the Recption children have used their imagination to travel all over the world... by boat, car, bus and even by digger! The children have just loved looking at different types of transport and listened to the key text 'You Can't Take an Elephant on the Bus.' They have written about their favourite form of transport and explored the differences between old and modern trains. The children have been very busy in phonics this week, learning the new sounds 'ow' (prowl and growl), 'oi', 'ear' and 'air'. In maths, the children have been looking at adding by counting on and adding two groups together to make a total.









This week year 1 have been learning about halving. They learnt how to halve shapes and quantities ensuring that each part was equal. They played a game on the playground where they had to collect half the amount of cones when given a number which was great fun. They finally found out what happened to Beegu the alien in English and have retold the story and written her two letters telling her all about themselves. The children decorated their puppets and had fun showing them off to each other and acting out little scenes with one another. In Computing the children learnt all about technology and where we might find it at school, home and in the community. We were surprised at how many places we could find it.







Year 2 have continued their investigations about measurement and have been looking at Weighing and Mass this week. They have compared and ordered objects according to their mass and they have been learning how to read scales. In English they have continued to use the video story of "The Clocktower", and having described the setting last week, they wrote about the dilemma faced by the little dancer and how she made the decision to keep the clock going for the good of others. In Geography, the children are learning to apply their mapping skills and understanding of position and direction to engage in some orienteering around the school grounds! In Science, we have been drawing some interesting conclusions about how plants grow, and the children are very excited to see their bean seeds flourishing! The children enjoyed the chance to design and make their own healthy food wrap this week in Design and Technology, and over the last few weeks they have learned where our food comes from, what makes a balanced diet and features that can make food appealing to consumers. The children are certainly well-equipped to help plan great family picnics this summer!


