The Reception children just loved their Pirate Day this week. Thank you parents for dressing them up so well, they had such fun!

Next week, on Tuesday, children will have a transition morning. They will meet their new teacher and see their new classroom. During this morning, parents will be notified of who their child's next teacher is. This will be via ParentMail. Parents should drop Reception and Year 1 children to school as normal and collect as normal. The majority of our Year 2 children will go to their junior school first thing in the morning, with no need to come onto our school site. The children will be brought back to our school in the afternoon for normal collection. Please read the information provided to you by the junior school. Year 2 children who are not visiting their new junior school for transition on Tuesday will be looked after in school during the transition morning by members of our staff. They should be dropped to school as normal.

Excitingly, the farm will join us in school next Thursday!! I hope the children are as excited as I am. This has been kindly funded by our amazing PTA - thank you. We have sent information about the visit, remember, all children will need an extra pair of footwear to change into - animals can be messy!

Finally, this evening, for the first time in 18 years, 7 of our planets will align in the night sky. Astronomers call this a 'planetary parade'. You will be able to see at least 5 of the planets with your own eyes (Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn) with Neptune and Uranus only visible with apparatus.

Reception Aha me hearties! The children have had a wonderful week with all things pirate and enjoyed listening to the key text of Bodhi the Pirate Dog. The highlight of the week was most definitely pirate day on Wednesday, when Reception was taken over by little pirates! The children all looked fantastic in their attire and had lots of fun making flags, looking for treasure, singing songs and playing pirate games. In maths, the children have investigated odd and even numbers and continued to use all of their sounds and 'harder to read and spell' words within reading and writing in phonics.

Year 1 This week year 1 have been working on embedding their knowledge of adding, subtracting, multiplication and division through solving word problems. They looked for clues to help them figure out which process to use. They also worked with numbers to 100 by ordering them. In English we have taken our theme of coasts and the seaside to focus on 'The Lighthouse Keeper' stories. The children retold the story and wrote a description of Mr Grinling, the lighthouse keeper. The children also learnt about plurals. They learnt about adding 's' or 'es' to nouns when there is more than one. They played a game on the playground where they had to find their matching plural partner which was great fun! In Art we have also followed our coastal theme by recreating postcard pictures in our sketch books of lighthouses, boats and beaches. They had to look very carefully and take their time to make sure they were nice and detailed. Our Computing lessons over the last 3 weeks have been retelling the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' on Purplemash. The children have loved doing this and have done a really good job typing and drawing the story.

Year 2 Year 2 have been learning about capacity and volume this week, and understand the difference between them! We have been reading scales and working out problems – measuring in millilitres means that we have been reading and calculating some big numbers! We have been learning how to write letters for different purposes: one describing the awful conditions that Florence Nightingale found at Scutari Hospital and the changes she made there, as well as to the nursing profession and women's right to work and the other letter – an invitation to an imaginary party! In Science we have been learning to identify and categorise invertebrates and in Computing we have been revisiting ways to stay safe while working online. We are sure you will continue to promote safe use of the internet at


