

This week we have been reading *The Worrysaurus* by Rachel Bright and talking about some worries we may have. We made worry dolls to share our worries with.

On Monday, the children witnessed a crime scene in the playground – Humpty had fallen off his wall and the King's Men and Horses had come to help! We have enhanced our learning through activities based around Humpty Dumpty such as nursery rhymes, positional language, number recognition and counting to 5, puzzles (putting Humpty back together again), and fine motor skills that include tracing, cutting and painting. The children started their first phonics lessons this week with phase 2 sounds and are starting to recognise and write the letters: s, a, t, p.






Year 1 have had a great week. We have loved learning more about Space and have been finding out and writing facts about all the different planets. In Science we have talked about our 5 senses and have drawn and labelled the features of our faces. We have continued with our Computing work on the laptops and this week the children logged onto their Purple Mash account. The logins for this are in the back of the children's reading diaries so if you can, please do help them to practise logging in at home. In Maths we have worked on finding one more and one less and enjoyed lots of practical activities to help our learning. Last week we learnt about the primary colours in Art and this week we had great fun mixing colours to make new ones.

This week Year 2 have learnt about the external features of a castle, including a gatehouse and the purpose of a portcullis. During DT the children have created a structure from a net and have been very excited to start the construction of their castles. In Maths we have continued our learning of place value, applying our knowledge of number to estimating on a number line. Our English learning this week has been centred around commemorating the life of Queen Elizabeth in a leaflet. We even found out the Queen trained to be a mechanic in Camberley during WW2!

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Reading - Oxford Owl

Reading is the most important aspect of any school's curriculum. Reading inspires children, improves vocabulary and speaking, helps with writing and is a genuine life skill that opens the doors for your child's future.

All children will have a book issued to them. This will be in their bookbag. These books will be at your child's reading level. Books should be readable and not too challenging – children should be able to read them successfully. This improves the chances of children developing a love and passion for books. If they are too challenging, research shows reading then becomes a chore and is not as enjoyable for young readers. Children must also be able to comprehend/understand the book they have read.

Children in Reception will start their phonics lessons next week. For now, they will be issued with a wordless book. Children learn how to hold and use a book; turning the pages and talking about the images they see. Parents can ask questions such as:

- What can you see in the picture?
- What number is on the page?

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- What do you think will happen next?
- What is your favourite picture why?
- What part of the story would you change why?


In addition to children's books in book bags, our school also has an online eLibrary. This allows teachers to allocate groups of books to children. These can be read at home on a laptop, iPad, tablet or mobile device. At school, we will monitor which children are using the eLibrary and prizes will be awarded to those participating consistently.

I cannot encourage and emphasise enough how important it is to read at home with and to your child. We will be running phonics workshops for parents this term to help empower you all to continue supporting your children at home.
