
## Summary of Parent Survey 2023

## **Overview of Additional Comments**

- Parking issue is a concern as parents park in unsafe areas. Suggested to have a traffic warden to issue tickets or allow parents to park inside for drop-off only.
- · Parents evenings have been informative, and the school keeps parents up-to-date with events and activities.
- Some parents want more feedback on their child's progress and achievements at school as they cannot drop off or pick up their children regularly due to work commitments.
- Some parents would like more guidance on how to support their child's learning journey and to have a consistent way of teaching things.
- Some parents are concerned about the difference in facilities across the TAMAT group and suggested improvement to align with junior schools.
- Parents have expressed their satisfaction with the school's care for their children and their progress.
- Some parents are thrilled to see the principles from Covey's book being applied in the school.
- The headteacher is commended for his supportive and transformative leadership.
- Parents appreciated the school's communication and support during their children's transition to the school.

## Overview of Parent Survey
