This week got off to a sailing start with the whole school embracing our theme of Viking Day! The children just absolutely excelled all day, visiting all of the classrooms across the school on a rotation. Thank you to Mrs McDermott (our History lead) and all staff for their support making the day such a success.

Next Tuesday we will have our transition day. Year 2 children attending Crawley Ridge Junior School should be dropped off directly to the junior school; our staff will collect them after lunch. If your year 2 child is moving on to a different school, they should attend school as normal (unless their new junior school also has their transition day on the same day as ours!). All other year groups should be dropped off as normal.

We have had some queries regarding the use of Tapestry in Early Years. Tapestry is an expensive resource that we used to use frequently. Funds in schools are extremely tight and we have not been able to justify its continued use. I also have to be mindful of staff workload. Therefore we will be phasing out its use in the next academic year. Parents will be able to download Tapestry journals soon, with any content that was added to Tapestry this year.

This week in early years, we have...

We have had a very exciting week!

In Forest School, it was all about the bugs! First, we went on a mini-beast hunt, looking up high in the trees and down underneath logs and leaves. We found lots of woodlice, centipedes, a worm, tiny spiders and even a huge bumblebee! Next, we built our own bug homes using twigs, leaves and moss, making sure they were dark and cosy. Hopefully we'll have some insects move in!

In the rest of our time this week, we have been reading *Mrs Armitage On Wheels*. We have been enjoying finding out about the bike creation she builds, complete with snacks, horns, an umbrella and a sail! We have started thinking about what we would love to add to our own bike and we will design and make our own invented (miniature!) vehicles next week. We have enjoyed our bicycle repair shop outside, using the tools to fix the bikes and, of course, then testing them out! Whooooosh!









The children had a wonderful time with their History Day around the theme of Vikings on Monday. The children loved listening to a 'real' Viking who came to school and exploring all the different tools and items he brought with him. We asked lots of questions, showing our interest and got involved with activities such as making a longboat and writing our names in Viking writing!

Our story of the week has been *What the Ladybird Heard*. We loved listening to the story and hearing about all the different animals. This has led us to the theme of farms where we have painted, drawn maps, looked at the young of different animals, set up our very own farm shop and talked about where different foods come from. We have loved playing in the small world area, setting up our own farms, building farm houses and moving animals around the areas. The children worked hard on their amazing writing this week, choosing an animal to write sentences about. In our maths we have continued to look at odds and evens and have started recapping different topics such as number bonds to 10 and teen numbers.



















This week in KS1 we have...

This week started with the exciting and engaging Viking Day with a carousel of activities for the children to learn about Viking life in the past including how the alphabet is used, making long ships, as well as a class large long ship model! The interactive workshop allowed the children to handle swords and learn about how Vikings lived. Our work on lighthouses has continued. We ordered lighthouses from ancient to modern and learnt how they worked with special features. In maths, coins have been studied to recognise the different coins and notes, order by value and make totals by adding coins together. The children have been looking at how suffixes are used in grammar during out study of the story of the 'The Enormous Turnip' in English. They retold the story very well in their writing checking they included the correct punctuation. During science we have continued work on animals with a focus on the characteristics of amphibians. In design technology the children have enthusiastically used a template and cut out their designs for their hand puppet. They have now moved on to attaching the two pieces of felt using running stitch which we learnt last week. A successful week, Year One!







Year 2 loved their history Viking day this week, especially the special visitor. It was amazing to see all the axes, animal furs and jewellery. We have been building upon our knowledge of tally charts and tables. This week we have presented the data as pictograms in increments of 1,2, 5, 10. We've loved data inputting! We have used drama to prepare for our writing next week. We empathised with soldiers staying in the hospital in Scutari with Florence Nightingale by dressing up and acting. In history we have learnt about the changes in medical practice during the Victorian era brought on by the determination of Florence Nightingale. We compared Victorian hospitals and modern hospitals, noticing the similarities and differences. We have continued to practice for Sports Day by turn taking and throwing at a target.


What is the Parenting Puzzle?

The Parenting Puzzle Workshops help deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier life.

A tried and tested programme, it helps us think about what we do, why we do it and how it makes us feel

The Building Blocks of the Parenting Puzzle





The Four Workshops

Workshop : Understanding Children's Behaviour, Listening and Communicating, Praise and Encouragement

Workshop 2: Praise and Guidance vs. Criticsm, Child-led Play, and Positive Moments

Workshop 3: Boundaries and Parenting Styles, Time to Calm Down, Dealing with Stress and Conflict

Workshop 4: Choices and Consequences, Behaviour to Ignore, Putting the Puzzle Together, Looking after Ourselves

Practical information

There are four 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break

10-20 parents are invited and there are two Family Links trained group leaders

partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with another relative or friend

Some groups provide a creche; check with group leaders beforehand

you need to come to all four workshops: they fit together like a puzzle

you will be provided with a copy of The Parenting Puzzle book to accompany the workshops,
