## This week in early years, we have...

This week we have continued with our *Mrs Armitage on Wheels book*. We have enjoyed threading our own 'wheels' using wool and a paper plate. Some of the children were really enjoying the measuring tape in the bike repair shop, so we got found other measuring equipment for the children to try out, like metre sticks and a trundle wheel. We've had great fun measuring things in our outdoor area.

In Forest School on Wednesday, we had our own colour hunt! The children worked in pairs to search for objects of different colours, then weaved the leaves, twigs and petals in between the bands on their colour boards. 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## This week in KS1 we have...

What a week of excitement and change! The children loved finding out their new classes this week and thoroughly enjoyed meeting their new teachers. In maths we have started learning about the passing of time. We have looked at the terms before and after and then moving on to remembering days of the week and months of the year. In writing we have been learning the prefix 'un'. Our focus story was called **Mr Un** and the children had great fun creating their own stories where Mr Un was unhappy, ungrateful and untidy. In History we found out about Grace Darling who lived in a lighthouse and rescued 9 people from a shipwreck in a storm. The children found her story fascinating and heroic. To end the week the children finished sewing and decorating their puppets and took part in sports day. The puppets are looking brilliant and all the children put in lots of effort and enthusiasm for all the activities they competed in during the day. Well done to them all! We are so proud of year one and their incredible sportsmanship today.



Year 2 have been incredibly excited for sports day this week. We have practiced all our activities and have enjoyed cheering our team mates on. In English we have written from the perspective of a soldier staying in Scutari writing to their family about the changes in the hospital since Florence Nightingale arrived. The children wrote so descriptively and thought carefully about the purpose of the letter. In Maths we have revisited position and direction using the language of clockwise and anticlockwise. In art we have carried out observational drawings of plants focusing on shading using the skills we have built up over the past few weeks. They look great! The NED visit this week was incredibly engaging, the children keep referencing NED's positive message. In history we have learnt about the amazing Mary Seacole, a woman who used her own earnings to create 'The British Hotel'. A place for soldiers of the Crimean war to rest and be healed. Her determination to help others no matter the challenge is truly inspiring. In Science we searched for the crustation woodlice. We investigated the microhabitats they live in and the conditions they are best suited. Did you know woodlice have gills?
