This week, we have read *The Hundred Decker Bus* by Mike Smith. We have been enjoying bus-related activities, such as building buses outside, creating different types of weird and wonderful decks for our bus, with swimming pools and boats galore! We've also enjoyed crafting our own double decker buses and paying for bus tickets.










Our story of the week has been *Commotion in the Ocean* so we have been looking at all things underwater! We created a joint painting collage of an underwater scene on which we stuck different animals that live in the ocean, we have sketched different shells and learnt all about the different oceans around the world. We recapped a previous story, *Someone Swallowed Stanley* and discussed the ways in which we can look after our oceans.

During our phonics, we have been revisiting our learning and securing our knowledge ready for year 1! In maths we have been looking at taking away and subtraction, we have used resources and begun to write number sentences. We have loved listening to a range of underwater stories this week, especially the rainbow fish where we all created our own scales to show we are different. We have all written about our favourite sea creature, describing what it does and looks like.



















This week in KS1 we have...

It may feel like we are in wind down mode but I can assure you that we are not. We have had another jam packed week of fun. We have been reviewing our learning in maths by re-exploring measure, including weight, capacity, length and height, we have also looked back at grouping/sharing (using arrays) along with comparing number and number bonds. In English this week we have read *Gracie the lighthouse cat* by Ruth Brown. We noticed that in the background of the story it was linked to Grace Darling and her rescue of 9 sailors. We worked hard to retell the story in the style of The Lighthouse Cat. In science we have been looking at the characteristics of a reptile. The children are thoroughly enjoying this topic. Ask them to tell you about the characteristics of a mammal, bird, amphibian and fish. We have leant about the history of travel to the seaside and how it has changed. As we said, another super busy week!











YEAR
