This week in early years, we have...

This week, we have been reading **The Very Helpful Hedgehog**, which is all about kindness and being friends. We have enjoyed retelling the story using our acting skills to act out the scene of the hedgehog and the donkey being good friends to one another.

We have enjoyed other various autumnal activities, such as scooping floating apples, cooking with conkers in the mud kitchen, press printing with apples and making playdough hedgehogs.

We have been working on our gross motor skills outside, using big pushes to roll the tyres down our track. What a fun week we've had!



This week our story of the week has been **'The Enormous Turnip'**. We have been HEAVING big turnips across the playground, sketching some turnips and describing how they feel. The children have been fantastic at getting involved and joining in with the repetition within the story.

Our phonics sounds this week have been g, o, c and k. We have looked at ostriches, made octopuses, coloured camels, made kites and sorted conkers into which **c** or **k** they are.

In our maths we have been focusing on repeating patterns, creating our own through actions, blocks and natural resources.

We have been continuing our discussions around our families and special people in our lives.



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This week in KS1 we have...

This week in Year 1, the children have been learning about Tim Peake for English. They were fascinated by his journey of being an astronaut. In maths, we have been ordering numbers and objects. We have been focusing on the sense of touch for science. In RE, children had to create a harvest festival food collection drawing. Children have enjoyed making self-portraits using the laptop, they are getting to grips with navigating the mouse pointer. They were using all the skills they had learnt this term to create a sequence of different balances and travelling movements for gymnastics.

We ended our week with Space Day! The children have enjoyed singing space songs and participating in many lovely activities. It was lovely seeing parents/guardians coming to watch the children singing.



We've had such fun this week! We have learnt about alliteration and rhyme in English within the story of *Sir Charlie Stinky Socks and the really big adventure*. We are excited to write our own version next week! In maths we have been adding using our knowledge of number bonds to make ten when adding two 1-digit numbers, three 1-digit numbers and add to the next ten. In music we have learnt about pulse and rhythm using our voices and percussion instruments. In P.E we have worked on our balances and incorporated travelling movements using equipment. During R.E we have explored how Shabbat can be seen as a gift and created visual representations of our ideas. In D.T. we have been adding winders to our fantastic castles – we can't wait for you to see them on castle day next Monday!
