## This week in early years, we have...

This week, we have continued our theme of fireworks and learning about Diwali. We spoke about how Diwali is the festival of lights and we spent time carefully decorating candle holders with beautiful jewels and sparkly sequins. We have enjoyed building rockets using blocks and talking about the shapes we chose to use. On Friday, we learnt about Remembrance Day and the importance of poppies and what they represent. We enjoyed creating our own poppies in various ways, using collage or finger painting.

Outdoor Learning Day was lots of fun; making and using mud paints, going on a leaf hunt and playing games with our friends in Reception.











We have had an exciting week along the theme of our story, *Funny Bones*. We have created our very own dark dark towns with dark streets, made skeleton puppets and put skeletons back together. We've loved the doctors surgery in the home corner where there have been lots of broken bones to see too! We also looked at body parts and what bones we have inside our body. We talked about how we are the same and different and focussed our PSHE on what makes us special.

We learnt about what towns are and studied our town, Camberley.

On Thursday we loved outdoor learning day where we made nature crowns and bracelets, created pictures out of leaves, listened to the story *'Leaf Man'* and enjoyed our mud kitchen and sandpit. On Friday we had a focus around Remembrance Day, discussing why we wear poppies and what the day is all about - we made our own poppies too.

On top of all that fun, we carried on with our phonics, learning four new sounds – h, b, f, ff, l and ll as well as focussing on positional language in maths, creating assault courses, going over, under, in, next to, between, in front and behind!



















## This week in KS1 we have...

Y E A R


What a super week we have had. We have been learning number bonds within 10 and writing addition fact family sums for maths. In science, we continued our 'seasons' topic by discovering which seasons our birthdays fall in. We did a tally chart and used the data to make bar charts. For PE, we have started to explore yoga and mindfulness. Year 1 all showed how to do the sitting pose and calm breathing. For English, the children were inspired by the story called *Owl Babies* by Martin Waddell to create a picture of owls. They enjoyed other activities linked to the story, as well as writing a letter to one of the characters in the story.

We completed food tasting for D&T, focusing on texture and taste and discussing what our bodies need to stay healthy. We also learned about Remembrance Day and why we wear poppies. We had Outdoor Learning Day, and the children thoroughly enjoyed the activities!









We have started our new topic this week, The Great Fire of London. We have found out when the fire started in relation to other historical events, and how the fire spread so quickly. This week in English we have learnt about poetry. Did you know there are over 50 different types of poetry? We explored some very funny limericks, acrostic and shape poems. We learnt how poets perform and engage their listeners through facial expressions, tone and body language and even had a go ourselves. In Maths we have begun to add two 2-digit numbers together using practical and drawn methods, as well as starting to subtract two 2-digit numbers. In Computing we have been learning about algorithms through Google Draw. We found it fascinating how artificial intelligence is being developed. Yoga is our new unit in PE, it felt very powerful to start the lesson with affirmations. We enjoyed the flow of poses and will keep practicing our calm breathing. In Science we have built on our learning from Year 1 identifying materials and their properties. Our Art has been inspired by Clarice Cliff, we have drawn things bigger and smaller to create perspective in our sketches.


