This week in early years, we have...

This week we have celebrated World Nursery Rhyme Week, along with lots of other schools and nurseries around the world. We focused on a different nursery rhyme each day. Monday was Jack and Jill, where we explored filling buckets using vocabulary like 'full', 'half full' and 'empty' and turned our home corner into a doctor's surgery for our bumped heads! Tuesday was Hickory Dickory Dock, where we made mice from playdough and built our own clocks and clock towers. Wednesday was Head Shoulders Knees and Toes, where we learnt lots about our body parts. Thursday was Row Row Your Boat, where we explored floating and sinking in the water tray and built our own boats. Friday was The Wheels On The Bus, with junk modelling our own buses, cleaning buses in our 'bus wash' station and using our imagination with small world play. We have also interweaved Kindness Week in to our play; making bracelets for our friends, making kindness posters and reading stories about being kind. What a busy week!











Our learning has been focussed around our story of the week – *Goldilocks*. On Tuesday we came into school to find that Goldilocks herself had visited, spilt porridge all over the floor, eaten baby bear's porridge and broken a chair! We have created bears in different ways, made maps to help Goldilocks find her way home, played in bears cottage and created new chairs and wanted posters to help the bear family.

On Monday we celebrated Diwali in class, learning what the festival is about and creating our own candle holders.

In our phonics we have been recapping all of our sounds as well as focussing on the harder to read and spell words. In maths we have been looking at the numbers 4 and 5, as well as constructing these numbers using 'more'.

This week we started a new club called the drawing club. The children take part in the club every day which ignites their imagination and literacy skills. The children are so excited when we tell them we are doing drawing club and have come up with some amazing ideas!

On Friday we enjoyed kindness afternoon where we learnt all about the importance of being kind and rotated around the school for the afternoon, taking part in different activities.

YEAR1


Another full-on week of fun in Year One has been had. We started off the week with a walk around our school grounds looking for the ever-growing signs of autumn. The language the children were using to describe the autumnal leaves blew us away. We followed up our walk by reading our wonderfully descriptive book of the week; *Hello Autumn* by Jo Lindley. This led us beautifully into some descriptive writing using plenty of adjectives. Our maths has progressed into learning number bonds of 10 - ask them some questions, I bet you can't catch them out. By the end of the week we have even managed to write our number bond equations systematically. In history we enjoyed sharing our favourite toys with our friends and talking about how lots of us had similar favourites. In Science we were discussing why some trees drop their leaves and others do not. We learnt the words 'deciduous' and 'evergreen'. Kindness week has been so much fun, we wrapped up the week by having a kindness afternoon full of wonderful crafty activities around the school.











We have really embraced kindness week and especially loved our kindness afternoon. In English we have created our very own autumn fire poems using onomatopoeia, similes, adventurous adjectives and even some rhyme. In maths this week we have applied our knowledge of adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers to word problems. We had great fun in science where we were exploring that an object (spoons) can be made from different materials and how the properties of those materials can help the object meet its purpose. In music we have learning and practicing our Christmas play songs. 'Maa' Knobbly Knees is a firm favourite so far. In PSHE we have looked at how we make others feel and used drama to act out a scene to see other people's points of view. In Art we have learnt to apply our painting skills in the style to Clarice Cliff with bright, bold primary colours and selecting the appropriate paintbrush for different parts of our painting.




