

This week in early years, we have...

The start of the week continued our focus on **Postman Bear**, and we enjoyed celebrating the Bear's birthday with balloons, a party and, of course, fancy birthday crowns. Carrying on our theme of 'Bears' has led us to **Goldilocks and the Three Bears**, and we have enjoyed retelling the story using small world figures. We have fine-tuned our pencil control by tracing bears on our new light box table and we have loved making our own bowls of porridge, with lots of pouring, scooping and stirring. The children took part in some yoga on Thursday too, with everyone trying their best to stretch and balance – well done









We have been learning all things 'People who help us' this week, from police officers, firefighters to doctors and vets. The children have loved immersing themselves in the role play area with doctors surgeries, vets and dentists and dressed up, also creating their

In phonics we have learnt two new sounds - igh (light up the night) and oa (float on the moat), we have drawn goats, seen if our boats float and made firework paintings to light up the night. In our maths we have been talking and learning about shorter and taller, comparing different sized objects.

Our drawing club has been based around the 70s cartoon - Mr Ben. We have drawn our own Mr Ben, created our own zoo and made up a new animal to have in the zoo.

We have loved taking part in a hunt around the classroom for harder to read and spell words and independently writing these. The children have also completed some brilliant writing and drawing about what they want to be when they grow up.

We carried out a science experiment on Monday to find the best cape for **Supertato**. We noticed that plastic was the best material compared to paper and tissue, as it did not soak up any water and would keep him dry! We talked about keeping things the same and changing specific things in a science experiment to make sure that it is fair.



















This week in KS1 we have...

YEAR1

It was scorching hot in the classroom as Year 1 had an experience day being in Kenya, which is linked to our story called *Handa's Surprise* by Eileen Browne. We explored a basket of fruit to help us think of interesting words to describe what each fruit feels, tastes and smells like. We also used lots of descriptive words to describe the hot setting, to make our writing interesting. The children blew us away with their choice of words and writing.

For maths, we worked on doubles and near doubles within 20. For computing, we created our rockets by following the instructions and using the digital equipment list from the previous lesson.

As it was a National Storytelling Week, we had parents/carers volunteering to read to the children, it was a cosy and lovely experience, and the children loved it! Thank you to the parents/carers who dedicated their time to read to us!











YEAR?

We have loved national story telling week! We have read and listened to so many wonderful stories, thank you to all the people who took the time to read to us this week. We have loved our book from English 'The Kapok Tree' as it has beautiful illustrations and a strong moral message. This has helped us to identify and use verbs, adverbs and create expanded noun phrases. In maths we continued learning about multiplication, including the two times table and have looked at the inverse operation division. We have divided by sharing and grouping practically and using pictorial arrays. In science we have classified animals by whether they are herbivores, omnivores or carnivores using Venn diagrams. We have taken our knowledge of human and physical geography and used it to identify the geography in the UK using atlases.



















Changes after half-term

Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Changes to Birthday Celebrations at Crawley Ridge Infant School

I wanted to take a moment to update you on a recent decision regarding the way we celebrate birthdays at Crawley Ridge Infant School.



In the past, we have allowed children to bring in sweet treats to share with their classmates on their birthdays. While this has been working well so far, the idea still poses challenges that affect the well-being and inclusivity of our school community.

I have observed an increasing number of children with various dietary needs, allergies, intolerances, and religious dietary requirements. I understand the importance of catering to the diverse needs of our pupils, and we want to create an environment that is considerate and accommodating to all.

Additionally, I recognise that not all families can afford to provide treats for the entire class. We do not wish to place any financial burden on parents, nor do we want any child to feel left out or upset if they cannot contribute in the same way as their peers.

Moreover, managing these sweet treats at the end of the day has become increasingly challenging for our staff, who are already handling various responsibilities during this busy time.

After careful consideration, I have decided to implement a change to our birthday celebration agreement, starting when the children return to school after the February half term. Of course, if your child has a birthday before then, you can decide on either option.

After half-term, when a child is celebrating their birthday, they will have the option to come into school in their own sensible clothing. This is entirely optional, and we want to emphasise that there is no pressure on parents or children to participate. Instead of sweet treats, we suggest a more inclusive and educational alternative - the gift of a classroom storybook, which can be brought in at the beginning of the day and read at the end of day to honour your child's birthday.

To make the birthday celebration in class special, we will also be providing a unique birthday hat or a similar item to mark the occasion. This way, each child's birthday can be joyously celebrated within the class environment without the need for sweet treats.
