We worked hard to count bears and sort them by size from smallest to biggest and we have used lots of mathematical language to compare size (smaller, bigger, smallest, biggest, medium sized). We also enjoyed some PE in the hall; we've been balancing and moving in different ways.

We have celebrated upcoming Chinese New Year the second half of the week, learning about the signs of the zodiac and how the years are named after animals. We enjoyed trying to pick up slippery noodles with chopsticks and have made our own paper dragons.

We hope you all have a lovely restful half term.











In maths, we have been looking at the numbers 9 and 10, where we may find them, what they look like and how we can make them by adding two numbers together.






















# This week in KS1 we have...

It may be getting cold again outside, but in the year one classrooms it continues to be African climates. We wrapped up the week with an independent write all about Handa and her seven delicious fruits. We used similes to describe the fruit; a yellow banana, as squishy as slime. The children then edited their friend's work. They were far more critical about their friend's writing than they were about their own last week. In maths we have been finding the difference between two numbers. This is a tricky concept, but the children worked so hard and realised that it is as simple as a take-away sum. We were so impressed with the children's self-portraits in art last week. This week they had the opportunity to reflect on their artwork and evaluate what they would do differently next time. It has been a super busy half term, Christmas seems like a lifetime ago, the children are certainly ready for a rest. Can you believe that we are already halfway through the year? The children have come so far, and you should be very proud of them.

What an exciting half term! This week we have learnt about food chains using our knowledge of herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We have learnt that food chains begin with producers as they produce their own food from sunlight, water and carbon dioxide. In geography we read a beautiful book called '*The Lost Words: A Spell Book'* which contained lovely acrostic poems about nature using words that are being lost over the generations. We wrote our own acrostic poems inspired by physical features of geography. We have completed our fabric collages inspired by Eileen Downes and evaluated their effectiveness. In English we have completed our own versions of the story '*The Great Kapok Tree*' with a clear beginning, middle and end. We have used some fantastic adverbs to engage our readers. In maths we have been doubling and halving by multiplying and dividing by 2!
