We have some exciting news for you! We are taking part in the 15th year celebration of Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel, the UK's largest inter-school cycling, walking, wheeling and scooting challenge. The challenge runs from 11-22 March 2024. It's free to take part and we would love everyone to be involved.

What do you need to do?

Encourage your child(ren) to walk, use a wheelchair, scoot or cycle to school on as many days as possible during the event.

Including everyone

We want to make sure that everyone can get involved in Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel.

We know it may be more difficult for some pupils to take part than others. If you want to discuss more about your child(ren)'s specific needs, please contact your child's class teacher and we will make sure to look into how your child(ren) can take part.

Why we are taking part?

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to build physical activity in children's daily routine which is important for their physical health and mental wellbeing.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. <u>A 2021 YouGov study</u> showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school. And that children thought active travel was the best away to bring down these pollution levels.

Plus there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part!

This week in early years, we have...

This week, we have enjoyed a bit more learning about wiggly worms, making our own worm sock puppets and observing the worms in our wormery. Our learning has moved on to looking at frogs and their life cycle, reading the book *Teeny Weeny Tadpole*. We have talked lots about how tadpoles grow into frogs and we have made our own frog headbands. We have enjoyed building model ponds for our frogs too, complete with lily pads, ducks and fish.







This week our story has been **Stuck** by **Oliver Jeffers**. The boy in the story gets his kite stuck in a tree and repeatedly throws other objects at it to try and get his kite down. We have created our own kites, looked at different trees, practised our throwing and thought of our own ways to get the items down.

We have been talking all things hygiene this week and in particular, washing our hands. We learnt a new washing hands song to help us remember all the different parts.

Our sounds this week have been oo (spoon) and or (popcorn) where we have made unicorn horns, made room on the broom, created popcorn cones and painted with forks and corks.

In maths we have been looking at weight and capacity, testing how much we can fit into different sized containers and testing this out in our outdoor area.

We loved world book day on Thursday, the children's costumes were fantastic and they all enjoyed talking about their favourite stories. Each child created a badge about their book or reading and wore this with pride.



















This week in KS1 we have...

What a super busy week it has been for our Year 1! We started this week by introducing a new topic for English called, *In Every House on Every Street* by Jess Hitchman. It has beautiful illustrations and narration which kept us all engaged. We had to role play what might happen in each room and collected interesting words and verbs at the end.

For science, we investigated which materials are waterproof or not and found out which material would be ideal to make an umbrella. The children have enjoyed this and we are impressed with their use of their scientific knowledge.

We have been working hard on placing value within 50, looking at more than and less than a number, ordering the numbers and writing in words. We have moved to learning length and height which includes using language such as smallest to biggest. For history, we have looked into the past (the 1920s) and compared this to the present in our lives. The children recognised that their own lives were different from people in the past. Year 1 were all fascinated to find out the toilet in the 1920s would be located outside of the house and people would have to use a chamber pot in the middle of the night and this would be emptied in the morning!

It was World Book Day on Thursday; the children all looked amazing and enjoyed making badges related to our favourite books. It was lovely to see how the children enjoyed reading and talking about books!











What a week! We were so impressed by everyone's world book day outfits, well done! Our book in English this week has been *The Egg* by M. P Robertson, a lovely book about a boy named George who one day finds a gigantic, golden egg in his mother's hen house. We have been preparing for writing by building banks of exciting verbs and adventurous adverbs.

In maths we have been using our knowledge of measuring height and length to solve word problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

In DT we have created the base of our masks using our plans and layering materials to make them stronger.

Our geography learning has been comparing Brazil and England's capital cities, Brasilia and London.


