

Spring Holiday Bingo

Recent studies are revealing that prolonged Smartphone use by adults, in the presence of children, can negatively affect children's language development and emotional intelligence. Whilst Smartphones are amazing and positive in so many other ways, they may not be most conducive to supporting quality family time where all participants are present and having fun - which is what we hope to encourage!

Make pizza for tea

Most children love pizza and making it themselves is such a brilliant way to nurture a variety of skills including, language (mixing, pouring etc,) measuring, estimation, cooking as well as fostering independence through allowing choice of toppings and developing a positive relationship with food.

Grab your wellies and off you go!












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
