This week in early years, we have...

Our first half of the week saw us learning about our country and what fabulous things we have in England. We have enjoyed building structures of Stonehenge and Big Ben and writing postcards to our friends and family. Some of Year 1 came down on Friday to share the leaflets they had written about English landmarks themselves, it was lovely to see them.

We have moved onto learning about cold places, reading **One Day In The Antarctic**. We have loved mark making in the 'snow', learning about what polar animals like to eat and creating habitat pictures of polar bears and penguins. We enjoyed building our own igloos outside for our huskies and penguins, using crates, planks and white material. Next week, we will look at hot places!












Our story this week has been **Somebody Swallowed Stanley** which follows a plastic bag, called Stanley, who gets eaten by lots of different animals in the ocean. As it was Earth Day on Monday, we have been looking at ways in which we can look after our planet. We have talked about recycling, saving electricity, saving water and not littering. On Tuesday we had a saving electricity day where we had no screens or lights – the children said how much they enjoyed the day!

We have explored ocean animals, created our own underwater scenes, made posters about looking after our planet, sorted recycling and planted various flowers and seeds.

In phonics we have finished our sounds! We have been recapping the sounds we have learnt so far and are going to move onto consolidating our learning, practising our letters and forming sentences which make sense.

In maths, the children have learnt about adding more, using the language 'first, then and now'.

This week in KS1 we have...

Oh my goodness, what an incredibly busy week Year 1 have had this week. In our English we have been learning all about London, discovering facts about landmarks from around the city. We also explored the different types of transport we might see, like the red double decker buses, black taxis and of course going Underground. The reason for all of this exploration was to gather information to create an information leaflet for Floella, the main character in our story "Coming to England". In the story Floella leaves her home in Trinidad to come to England so we thought it would be a great idea to give Floella some ideas for the best places to visit in London. In Maths our focus has been on equal and unequal groups as we take our first small steps into multiplication. We have been checking to make sure all of our groups are equal, before seeing how many groups we have and how many of each item in these groups. Finally, we have been adding all the groups together to find a total. In Science we have continued with our learning about plants, with a spotlight this week in identifying and naming common garden flowers. We explored our own school grounds before taking a walk over to the junior school to see what we could find. In Geography this week we continued our travel around the United Kingdom, stopping in Scotland to discover more about it's national symbols, plants, food and capital city Edinburgh and in Art we are developing our knowledge and skills about sculpture.











What a busy week we have had! In English we have been writing and performing our own poems. The children did an amazing job of using all of the poetic devices we had learnt. In maths we have been exploring thirds and finding three quarters. In science, the children have been excited to see some of our seeds germinate. In DT we have carried out our own market research to find out what makes an appealing wrap. In geography we have continued to learn about maps and map symbols, and created our own sketch maps.

The Family Communication Officers (FCO's) have a range of knowledge and experience of additional needs and advocate the importance of early intervention for young people and their families to provide the 'right support at the right time'. The FCO's can support families with:

- Understanding the graduated response to SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities).
- What Ordinarily Available provision is and what this looks like in educational settings.
- Understanding a 'No to Assess' Educational Health Care Needs Assessment decision.
- Signposting to appropriate services for support, advice, and intervention.
