## REC

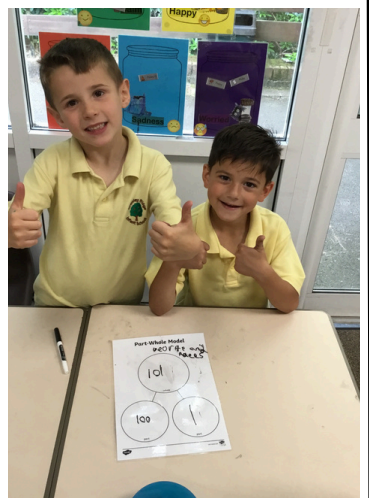

The children have completed obstacle courses, written speech bubbles saying what their favourite sport activity is, designed and made medals and flags and made sports stadiums out of junk modelling and blocks. The children completed a wonderful writing piece related to a summer beach scene too. In maths we have been recapping addition and subtraction bonds to 5, doubles and odds and evens.

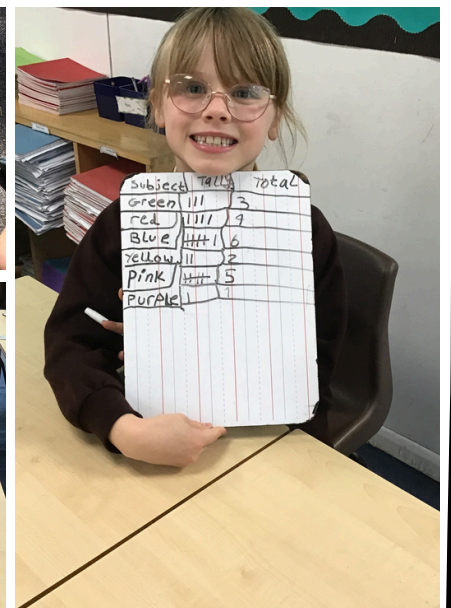
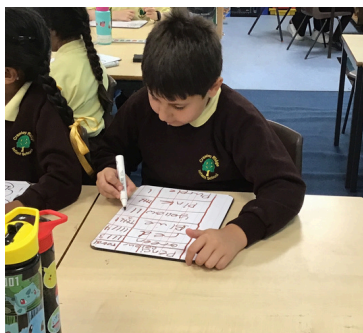
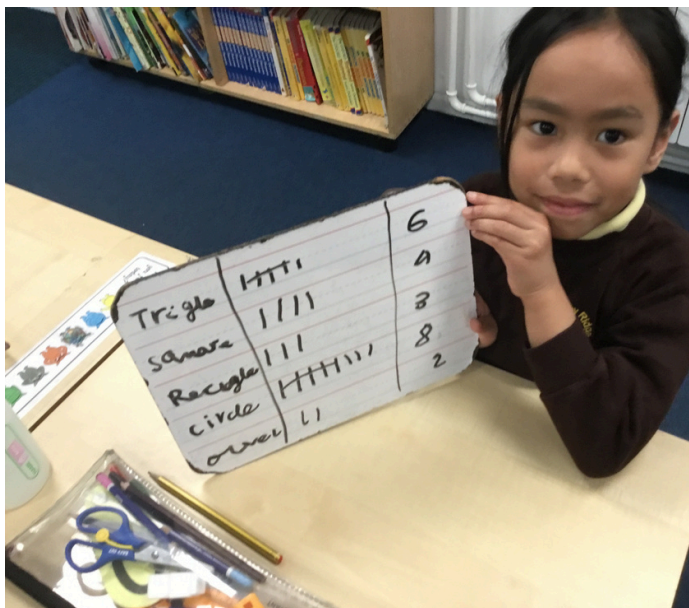

This week Year 1 had the pleasure of completing the annual Phonic Screening Check. The words this year were particularly challenging with some real "stinkers" amongst the alien words. However, to the children's credit they took it all in their stride and performed to the very best of their abilities. We are all very proud of them and the way they approached this challenge. English saw us continue with our learning from the story "**Clean Up!**" and this week we have focussed on how the plastic is getting into the seas and oceans, as well as who is responsible for the rubbish making its way into the water. Maths has seen us move on to working with numbers from 50 up to 100. We have counted in tens, explored missing numbers in a 100 square and we have also revisited partitioning of numbers into their tens and ones. In Science we continued our learning about different animal groups, this week learning about birds and the key features that make them different to other animal groups. Geography had us taking a visit to the beach, making sure we know how to keep ourselves safe and in DT we explored different joining techniques, making a simple paper version of the puppets we hope to make with fabric in a few weeks' time. On that point can we mention that in a few weeks Year 1 will indeed be sewing and making fabric puppets. So (or should that be sew?) if you are a dab hand with a needle and thread and are available to come in and put your skills to the test with a handful of small children with sharp, pointy needles please let your child's class teacher know. To end the week, we had our school sports day. The children performed magnificently, running, throwing, balancing and kicking with energy and joy. Thank you for your support and encouragement. Congratulations to all of the children for their fabulous effort on Sports Day. It was great to see the children cheering each other on and trying their best. In English this week we have been writing a character descriptions of **Horrid Henry**. The children made good use of expanded noun phrases and exclamation sentences in their descriptions. Then in maths we have been learning about statistics. The children have been learning to make and interpret tally charts, tables and lock graphs. In DT we carried out our own market research to find out which ingredients our target consumer group would like in a healthy wrap. We then presented our data in a pictogram. In science we looked at different types of seeds to see if the biggest seeds grew into the biggest plants. We also observed the growth of our squash plants. In history we explored how important Florence Nightingale's work was using secondary sources.

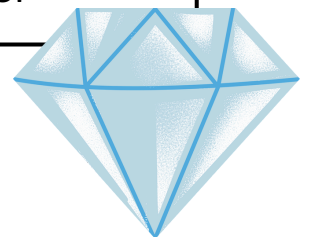

PLAYBALL HOLIDAY CAMPS AND DROP IN SESSIONS ARE BACK!! This summer we will be offering more camps and drop in sessions than ever before, however spaces at each will be limited so you will need to book early to secure a spot on your preferred dates. As always, the holiday activities are open to everyone, so feel free to get siblings involved and spread the Playball word to all your friends.

Over the course of the summer Playball will be running 16 holiday camps for children aged 3 - 12. You can book into as many or as few camps as you wish, and discounts will be on offer to those attending multiple days. Our camps will be running at Frogmore Infant School, Lightwater Village School, Bagshot Infant School and London Road. We will also be running shorter 45-minute drop-in sessions for 2 - 11 year old children to attend.

### What do the camps entail?

The camps are a 3 hour drop off service for children aged 3 - 12 years. Parents get to take the morning off and rest assured that your kids will be happily entertained, well looked after, and when we hand them back to you, will be thoroughly exhausted from all the fun and games! The children are split into age-appropriate groups, where we maintain our Playball ratio of coaches to children, and we guarantee a high quality and fun filled day of sports activities and games, followed by the ever-popular treasure hunt- to ensure that the kids are sent home happy. Weather permitting, we will also make use of the water bombs and water gun games to cool off the kids.
