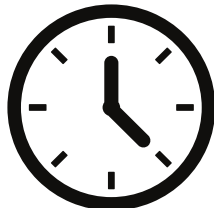

Wrap-around care



We offer two high-quality wraparound childcare options:

- ★ **5 O’Clock Club** (On-site at Crawley Ridge Infant School)
Run by familiar school staff, this after-school club provides a safe and nurturing space for play and relaxation, with snacks and activities.
- Open Monday–Friday (term time only)
 - 3:00–4:30pm (£9) or 3:00–5:00pm (£12.50)
 - Childcare vouchers accepted
 - Book online with half-termly invoicing

- ★ **Graitney Club** (Based at Crawley Ridge Junior School)
Caring for children aged 4–11, Graitney offers both breakfast and after-school care in a fun, play-focused setting.
- Breakfast Club: 7:30–8:30am
 - After School: 3:00–6:00pm
 - For Infant and Junior children
 - Limited space

Our School Clubs

A number of after-school clubs are held during the week. Each club is run by a provider who uses the school facilities for the venue. Clubs usually run for approximately 10 weeks excluding half term and Inset Days.

Clubs are offered to children in Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2) all year round and usually to children in Reception after the October half term.

Clubs finish at 15:45, 16:00 or 16:15 depending on the club type.



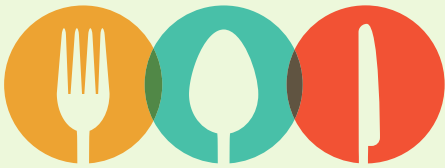
School Meals

School lunches for our Infant School children are provided **free of charge** under the Government's Universal Free Infant School Meals scheme.

Our kitchen is run by a catering team called Dolce. A large choice of meals is available, cooked on the premises in the modern well equipped kitchen.

The Nest provides a calm, safe and supportive space where children can build confidence, develop positive relationships and learn strategies to help them feel happy, settled and ready to learn.
